Ottawa, January 25, 2019 – The Court is launching a webcast pilot project to facilitate access to a broader selection of hearings of significant public interest for the media and members of the wider public. The pilot project builds on the Court’s [Policy on Public and Media Access](#) and [Strategic Plan \(2014-2019\)](#). The summary trial in file T-1736-14 has been selected as the first case under this pilot project.

**File T-1736-14 IN THE MATTER OF GWENDOLYN LOUISE DEEGAN ET AL
v. THE ATTORNEY GENERAL OF CANADA ET AL**

Summary: Action regarding the *Canada-United States Enhanced Tax Information Exchange Agreement Implementation Act* and certain provisions of the *Income Tax Act*, which relate to the collection and disclosure of taxpayer information to the United States of America.

Schedule: The trial is set for five days starting Monday, January 28, and is scheduled to begin at 9:30 a.m. (Pacific time) each day in Vancouver, B.C.

Language of hearing: English.
